Good day John,

Hope you and yours are well. I have attached some photos of the progress I am making on the convertible. It's taken a while and some trial and error, but I am making progress. I was lucky that a friend of mine has given me 2 Hyundai Excels and a KE55 Corolla for parts, along with an Datsun 120Y, which I purchased for \$250. It is surprising what you can use out of these.

So the steering column is out of the Hyundai Excel, because it uses 2 steering universal joints; the steering column is straight and at a nice angle. The pedal box is out of the Datsun 120Y and the brake booster/master cylinder is out of the 120Y too.

The disc brake rotors are from a 1986 RB9 Gemini, fitted to the standard Morris hubs

and I am using backing plates and calipers from the KE55 Corolla. I also found a newspaper article, which was tucked into a Morris manual I brought I thought might be of interest.
